

Campus Characteristics

- 23% Dry
- Of non-dry campuses 58% have on campus bars
- 54% have Greek organizations
- 58% state Greek orgs are very important to campus social life
- 97% have off-premise alcohol sales within 5 min drive; 95% have on-premise sales within 5 min.

Drug Free Schools Biennial Report

 79.5% reported that they are in compliance with the reporting requirement. 17.9% were not sure.

AOD Prevention Staffing

- 35% have an AOD preventionist position; of those only 36% have AOD as sole role.
- Almost all have Masters, 2 have Ph.D.
